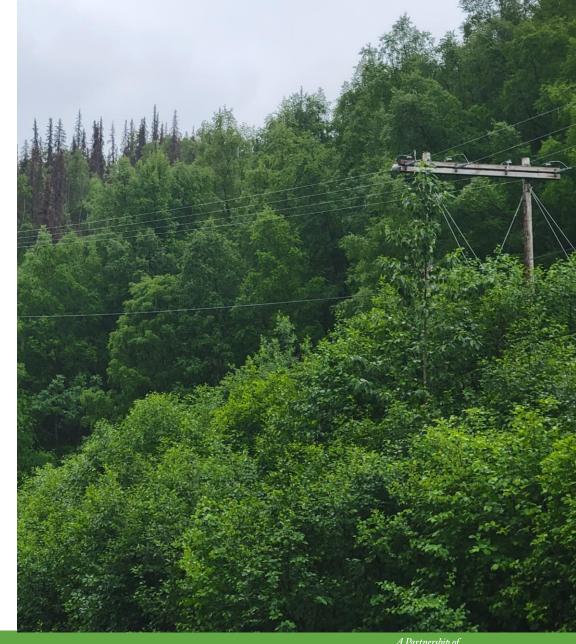

Sender Medium / Method Receiver

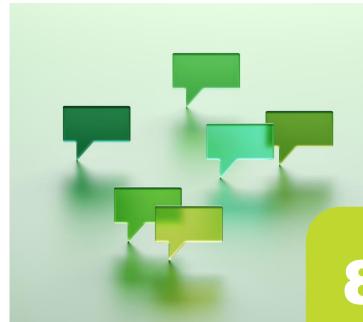
- Senders encode message(s)
- Receivers decode the message
- Receiver can then become a Sender

NON-VERBAL WRITTEN

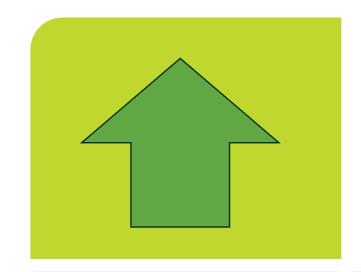

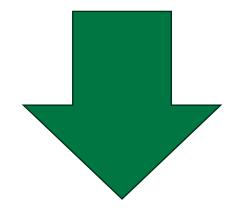

COMMUNICATION METHODS / MEDIUMS

PRINT MEDIA

GREAT FOR

canvasing a large area controlling the messaging

BUT

expensive and slow ignored and/or lost receiver relocates

Examples include flyers, door hangers, snail-mail

EMAIL / TEXTS

GREAT FOR

speed, inexpensive controlling messaging

BUT

junk filters (unread/unseen) database management

PUBLIC MEETING

GREAT FOR building trust Q&A, diverse opinions

BUTUnpredictable attendance

COMMUNICATION METHODS / MEDIUMS

PRESS RELEASES

GREAT FOR

controlled messaging new or upcoming projects

BUT

expensive and slow ignored / lost receiver relocates

SOCIAL MEDIA

GREAT FOR

speed, emergencies general education

BUT

unpredictable

Examples include Facebook, Instagram, X, YouTube

WEBSITES

GREAT FOR

inexpensive controlling messaging

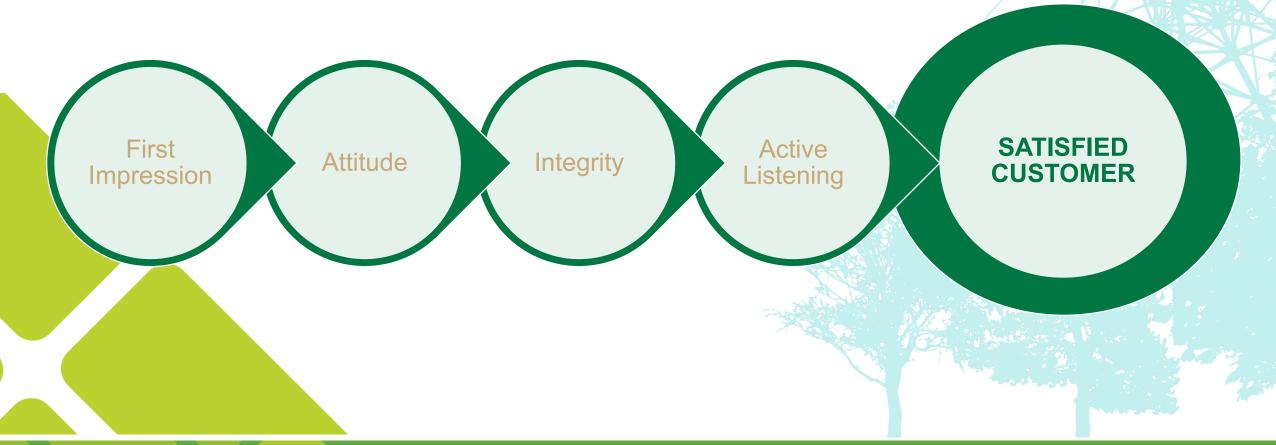
BUT passive

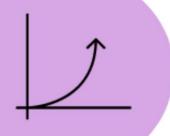
